INSERT STATE Executive Director Job Description

The Executive Director shall:

- Serve as the primary spokesperson for the association, monitoring the changing environment of the broadcast industry and understanding new media technologies and communicating that information to the board and membership.
- Shall lead the Legislative Team (dealing with the insert state legislature and our National Congressional Delegation. The Executive Director shall be confident and effective in presenting the insert state views on bills could potentially be detrimental to our members, and shall work with the NAB on garnering signatures for (or against) legislation that impacts our industry.
- Shall work to maintain all existing NCSA Sponsorships and explore potential additional (or replacement) sponsors.
- Shall be responsible for the day to day operations of the INSERT STATE, including the checking and investment accounts and provide monthly and/or quarterly financial reports to the INSERT STATE Board of Directors.
- Shall maintain the INSERT STATE office as a professional and organized business office.
- Shall organize with the President a MINIMUM of two board meetings, and keep the minutes of such meetings, except for executive sessions.
- Shall coordinate and organize all online and in-person sales training events, one at the convention and another in the spring of the year, preferably at various locations around the state.
- On a regular basis, visit with members to stations to find out how we can better help them; and visit non-member stations to explain the benefits of INSERT STATE membership.
- Shall work with the President and Vice President in planning the Annual Convention, getting input on programs, entertainment, etc. from a committee to be appointed by the President.
- Shall be responsible for frequent updates to the INSERT STATE website and for distributing information to all members, including a quarterly INSERT STATE newsletter.
- Shall establish and maintain relationships with state legislative leaders, elected official, industry members, and Advertising agencies.
- Shall employ and outside firm to review our financial situation, provide payroll information, and prepare Federal and State tax forms.
